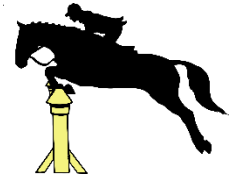

All camp fees are to be paid IN FULL prior to the camp.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Our camps offer positions to riders of all ages and ability.

Riders being led must have a capable leader with them at all times.

Full clinic payment required regardless of lessons attended.

Riders are encouraged to attend all lessons.

All riders must complete the Liability Waiver. Riders who are not financial members of EV/EA, AHS, SHCA, AERA, HRCV, an Interstate Pony Club or you hold your own personal liability policy for equestrian activities also pay an additional \$10 per day and must complete the Day Attendance form.

You MUST read the following rules and abide by them if you will be attending the Three-Day "Horsemanship Camp".



- ✓ Horses must be fit if they are to cope with all lessons planned for the clinic. You will need to commence a fitness program at least 6 weeks prior to the clinic, your horse's feed will need to increase according to the amount of work that they are doing. If you make an effort to prepare your horse for the camp they will have no problem coping with what is asked of them. Horses that are too fat or unfit will be placed into a very low group or may not be able to participate in some of the more strenuous activities.
- ✓ Horses feet must be in good condition, either recently shod or have had their feet trimmed prior to the clinic. To ensure that your horse is comfortable make sure that you clean out their feet prior to your first lesson. This will be checked at gear check.
- ✓ You must provide adequate high energy feed for your horse as well as good quality hay. Do not change your horses feed program at the clinic. Introduce some high energy feed as their workload increases. Make sure that you bring lots of feed – do not let your horse go hungry. Allow your horse to nibble at a haynet throughout the day.
- ✓ Each horse requires a waterproof rug in case of bad weather and as protection from the jaws of nasty horses. Regular checks will be made to ensure that all horses are being well cared for.
- ✓ Horses must be offered fresh water throughout the day. Remember to bring your own feed and water buckets (large water containers that are not easily knocked over and are more suitable than small plastic buckets) – do not share with others, as this is a sure way to spread germs.
- ✓ Riders are asked to hop off their horse's backs between lessons so that the horse may be rested prior to the next lesson. Loosen the horse's girth and throw a light rug over them so that they don't catch a chill.
- ✓ Horses are **not to be tied to unattached floats**. All horses are to be tied to string.
- ✓ Horses are **not to be ridden** during a FREE or LUNCH Break.
- ✓ If your horse is spending the night in a small yard please make sure that you rise early and take them for a walk around the oval to loosen them up. This could also be done prior to going to bed.

**PLEASE NOTE:** For a number of years our clinics have catered for Bealiba Pony Club members and many outsiders. ## RULES & CONDITIONS – "HORSEMANSHIP CAMP"



- ✓ While Full Pony Club uniform is not required all riders are requested to wear suitable Pony Club attire (jodhpurs, polo shirt, windcheaters) approved riding helmet ◊ASSA3838 standard ◊ EN1384 standard, made in 2015 or older ◊ EN1384 standard plus the VG1 standard ◊VG1 standard ◊ ASTM F1163 standard ◊PASO15 standard ◊ARBHS 2012 standard and fully soled riding boots.
- ✓ A daily Gear Check will be carried out prior to rider's first lesson. Only pony club regulation gear will be acceptable. (No sleeveless tops or jewellery) PCV Gear Rules January 2017
- ✓ PCV Sunsmart, alcohol and no smoking policies apply
- ✓ No stallions, colts or rigs.
- ✓ The organizing committee of neither the Bealiba Pony Club nor PCV accepts any responsibility whatsoever for any accident damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any other person(s) or property.
- ✓ Lungeing must only take place in the confined area designated exclusively for lungeing. (if there is no such area then lungeing is not allowed)
- ✓ The Bealiba Pony Club District Commissioner may change a rider/s from a group if she feels that they have been incorrectly grouped.
- ✓ The District Commissioner may change the program of the clinic if necessary.
- ✓ No refunds will be given unless a Doctors or Veterinary Certificate is produced within 7 days.
- ✓ Dogs must be kept under control and leashed at all times.
- ✓ Showers available.
- ✓ We are very fortunate to have 40 steel horse yards. Each camp participants will be allocated one yard, if bringing extra horses we will do our best to allocate yards for them. If this is not possible please bring suitable equipment to build another yard. Yards must be of solid construction. The use of electrified tape, strings, ropes or chains is not permitted. Electrified tape can be used as a top line or 'standoff' on a steel or solid yard, but not as a stand alone yard.
- ✓ The oval may be used for horses overnight. The horses must be caught and tied up prior to the first lesson the following day. Portable yards may also be built around the pony club grounds. **Please do not build yards on our cross-country course.**



### **Camping arrangements are as follows:**

This three-day camp will require lots of energy, so to ensure that everyone gets adequate sleep it may be a good idea to pitch a tent, bring a caravan or sleep in your horse float to ensure that when the lights go out you can get to sleep. Clinic participants may also bring a mattress & sleeping bag to throw down in our large clubrooms. There will be lights off curfew for riders but this will not guarantee that you will not be disturbed. Parents of small children are required to supervise them at bedtime.

### **We have a TELEVISION & DVD PLAYER**

You can sit back on the couch and relax while watching some of your favourite shows. Feel free to bring your own movies, please make sure that they are clearly marked with your name. Please be careful when around the above equipment as it is expensive and we don't want it damaged.

### MEALS

Clinic participants are provided with Breakfast & Tea. **Lunch is at your own cost.**

**Note:** Parents, relations and friends wishing to take advantage of the same meals as clinic participants may do so at a cost of **\$40.00 per person**. All riders & pre-paid meal purchases will be given a **wristband to wear** over the three days. The Canteen will open for Lunch each day, offering a variety of meals for **SALE**.

The Canteen will also sell drinks, lollies, cakes plus tea & coffee. If you would like to donate a cake, slice or biscuits to sell in the canteen it would be **greatly appreciated**.

### DRINK BOTTLES

All participants will be given a **named drink bottle** filled with water to take to each lesson. These will be refilled to ensure that everyone is drinking enough throughout the busy daily program. Two parents from each group will be responsible for delivering drinks to each lesson. Please check roster.

### NOTE:

Bookings for horse microchipping **MUST** be made prior to the camp. Payment required on the day, paid directly to the Vet in attendance.

Equivac 2 in 1 Tetanus & Strangles Injections **MUST** be ordered prior to the camp. Payment will be required prior to ordering.

Microchipping and the first Tetanus/Strangles injection will be given by the Vet in attendance on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> April.

### Goals of Horse Training

Effective communication and harmony between horse and rider are among the goals of proper training. The range of training techniques and training goals is large, but basic animal training concepts apply to all forms of horse training. The initial goal of most types of training is to create a horse that is safe for humans to handle (under most circumstances) and able to perform a useful task for the benefit of humans.

A few specific considerations and some basic knowledge of horse behavior helps a horse trainer be effective no matter what school or discipline is chosen:

- Safety is paramount: Horses are much larger and stronger than humans, so must be taught behavior that will not injure people.
- Horses, like other animals, differ in brain structure from humans and thus do not have the same type of thinking and reasoning ability as human beings. Thus, the human has the responsibility to think about how to use the psychology of the horse to lead the animal into an understanding of the goals of the human trainer.
- Horses are social herd animals and, when properly handled, can learn to follow and respect a human leader.
- Horses, as prey animals, have an inborn fight or flight instinct that has to be adapted to human needs. Horses need to be taught to rely upon humans to determine when fear or flight is an appropriate response to new stimuli and not to react by instinct alone.
- Like most animals, a young horse will more easily adapt to human expectations than an older one, so human handling of the horse from a very early age is generally advised.

Participants in events organised by PCAV Clubs, who are not current financial members of a PCAV Club, or who do not have any other approved insurance in place, upon completion of this form are deemed to be "Day Participants" of the event. Protection is afforded to the Day Participant under the PCAV Public Liability policy, only whilst participating in activities organised and/or run by the PCAV Club at that event, where they are liable for causing bodily injury or property damage to others, excluding whilst travelling to and from such event.

By signing this form, you agree to abide by the Rules & Conditions of the PCAV and any Rules of the event. For every Entrant who does NOT have a current and proven Public Liability insurance to the minimum of \$10,000.00 a payment is due of \$10.00 per person per day (including GST), to cover the cost of participation with this Pony Club for each day of this event.

### Horse Sports are a Dangerous Activity

I, the undersigned, in consideration for being permitted to participate in any way in horse sport activities and in particular this event, acknowledge and accept that:

Horse sports are a dangerous recreational activity and horses can act in a sudden and unpredictable way, especially if frightened or hurt.

There is a significant risk that serious injury or death may result from horse sport activities and in particular this event and freely assume all such risks, even if arising from the negligence of PCAV and/or the event organiser / official.

I voluntarily participate at my own risk and assume sole responsibility for any injury, death or property damage I may suffer that arises from my participation in horse sport activities.

I understand and acknowledge the dangers associated with the consumption of alcohol or any mind altering drugs before and during the activity and I take full responsibility for any injury, loss or damage associated with their consumption.

I agree to follow the directions of any event organiser or official and that any misconduct or refusal by me to follow any direction of any organiser or official can result in the cancellation of my participation in the event and my immediate removal from my horse no matter where that may occur. I further agree to abide by the Rules and Conditions of this event and the official Rule Book of the Pony Club Association of Victoria. I understand that any such non-compliance may result in injury, death and/or permanent disability and I agree to indemnify PCAV against all claims made by any person as a result of my failure to comply. I agree to wear a helmet at all times whilst riding and agree that I am solely responsible for ensuring that I wear a suitable helmet at all times while riding and take sole responsibility for my actions.

I, for myself and on behalf of my heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby release and hold harmless and agree not to sue the proprietors of the Pony Club Association of Victoria and/or the event organiser, their officers, officials, volunteers, coaches, agents and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, state bodies, affiliated clubs and if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the activities (all of whom are referred to as "Releasees") with respect to any and all injury, disability, death, or loss or damage to person or property, whether caused by the negligence of the Releasees or otherwise.

Effect of this Document - I have had sufficient opportunity to read this release of liability and assumption of risk agreement, fully understand its terms, understand that I have given up substantial rights by signing it, and sign it freely and voluntarily without inducement of any kind. I understand that my signature to this document constitutes a complete and unconditional release of all liability of the Releasees, to the greatest extent allowed by law in the event of me and/or the children under my care, suffering injury or death.

In consideration of your accepting my participation, I hereby undertake to indemnify the organising body against all claims, losses, suits and damages made against or suffered by the organising body by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any rider, driver, trainer or attendant whilst he/she is attending, riding, driving or otherwise handling any horse so entered or any other horse owned or entered by me, and I agree that any act or omission on the part of such rider, driver, handler or attendant found in any action against you to be negligent shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity.
